



The 36 fumbles

Backdraft is a professional development course that teaches you to look *back* at your first *draft* to spot, name and fix the 36 common mistakes that reduce clarity and impact. We call these mistakes *fumbles* because writers lose control of their writing—control that can be regained by correcting the fumbles in subsequent drafts.





How it works

Backdraft is a self-paced, online course. The course's 36 fumbles are divided into six semesters of six fumbles each. Approximately 14 to 20 hours is needed to complete the training.

Dashboard

Once signed in using email and password, learners arrive at the Backdraft dashboard, where they can access the course overview or begin the training.


Each section must be completed before proceeding to the next. Once you have completed all sections, you can move through each section at will to review the training.

Introduction

Learners proceed through five introductory screens:

- Welcome message
- 2 Course structure
- 3 Learning outcomes
- **4** Training resources
- Support

Note: Participants are encouraged to download the Backdraft Codex as a reference from the Resources page. The Codex lists all 36 fumbles with examples.



Lessons

Each of the 36 fumble lessons involves three steps:

- Read: A detailed review of each fumble with examples.
- Watch: An animated video gives fresh insight into each fumble.
- **Practice:** Six examples challenge students to spot the fumble.

Fumble reviews and tests

Backdraft provides a review of each semester's six fumbles before testing. Tests present 12 examples and challenge the learner to spot the fumble at play. Answers are identified as correct or incorrect. An explanation of each fumble example is provided.

Final review and exam

Following the Semester 6 test, learners review all 36 fumbles and then take the final exam. A score of 70% or higher is necessary to pass and ensure certification. Participants are encouraged to keep their fumble Codex handy as a reference.

Technical and training support

Learners who are having technical troubles are directed to platform resources. Questions relating to the course curriculum can be emailed directly to a Backdraft expert writer.

Certification

Those who have successfully finished the course are eligible to download a Backdraft certificate that attests to completion of the training.

Updates

Backdraft is updated regularly. For example, we create new examples to provide fresh insight into each fumble.
